ADMISSION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

To be eligible for admission to iDream School of Ministry, applicants must possess a high school diploma or a high school equivalency diploma, based on the General Education Development (GED) test. GED applicants must have achieved a total score of 225 with a minimum score of 45 in each section of the test. All applicants are required to submit an official transcript from each high school and post-secondary school attended iDream

School of Ministry does not accept credits from other Bible institutions. Please note that iDream School of Ministry. occasionally admits students who do not meet all of these requirements. Therefore, we encourage all those who are interested to apply.

Interested applicants must submit a completed application form to the Registrar by the date posted for admission prior to the beginning of classes each semester. Completed applications must be accompanied by the required twenty-five dollar (\$25.00), non-refundable application fee. Applicants must arrange to have an official transcript sent directly to iDream School of Ministry from each high school or post-secondary school attended. Transcripts delivered by hand without an official seal of the institution will not be accepted.

CREDIT HOUR ALLOCATION

Students will be granted 3 credits for each 3-hour course they complete. The student must receive a final grade 70% or better in courses. Students are expected to spend at least 3 hours outside of class in course preparation.

Certificates will be awarded to students in an annual awards program for the successful completion of any of the ministry tracks below:

Students who successfully complete one or more courses within a given year will receive a **Certificate of Completion** at the end of the designated school year.

Students who successfully complete a course or more every semester for a full year will receive a **Program Certificate** at the end of the designated school year.

Students who successfully complete a course of study in Bible, Counseling, Theology or Leadership and Success will receive a **Graduate Certificate** at the end of the designated school year.

Courses must be taken in the identified sequence as outlined by the instructor of each discipline.

ACCEPTANCE OF TRANSFER CREDIT



Students requesting to receive transfer credits for courses taken at another approved institution must submit a written request and an official transcript to iDream School of Ministry. This request must be submitted 4 weeks before the beginning of any semester. The student's request will be reviewed by the Dean of the iDream School of Ministry and its Board of Directors for approval. Courses will only be considered for transfer credit if the student has earned a grade of "C" or higher in the course.

TUITION AND FEES

Academic Year 2019-2020



The following tuition and fees must be paid before a student is admitted to class and are subject to change without notice.

Students are required to pay an annual non-refundable **Registration Fee** of \$50.00 per academic year. This fee is due at the time of registration. After the close of registration, there will be a **late fee** of \$10.00.

Students are required to pay a **Student Activity Fee** of \$25.00 (reception, graduation, etc.). This fee is non-refundable.

TUITION

Tuition is \$50.00 per credit for all classes.

1 - credit - \$50.00 each = \$50.00

2 - credits - \$50.00 each = \$100.00

3 - credits - \$50.00 each = \$150.00

4 - credits - \$50.00 each = \$200.00

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees are due at the time of registration. Students may remit payment by using credit cards, cash app or personal checks. All monies must be made payable to DreamLife Worship Center (DLWC). No third-party checks will be accepted. If a personal check is returned or a credit card purchase is rejected, the student must pay the amount of the check and a \$30.00 return check fee.

Return check fee policy: After two returned checks or two credit card submissions are rejected, the student must remit tuition and fees only in cash, using the cash app, credit card or certified check or money order payable to DreamLife Worship Center (DLWC).



TUITION ADJUSTMENTS

Institutional Refund Policy: The iDream School of Ministry will refund tuition according to the following policy:

- 1. A full refund, minus the registration and activity fees, will be given once evidence of illness is provided which disallows a student to start a semester or who has to drop the class within a two-week period.
- 2. A full refund, minus the registration and activity fees, will be given when a student has to transition to another state/country, which disallows a student to start a semester or who has to drop the class after a two-week period. The refund will be processed once the new address is documented.
- 3. A 90% refund, minus the registration and activity fees, will be given to a student disenrolling from the school on or before the first day of class. The disenrollment MUST be documented from the Director or the Registrar's Office.

Drop/Add Without Lose of Tuition/Fees: A student can drop a course within a two-week period if they are transferring to another class. An iDream School of Ministry Board member must approve and document the changes. There will be no full or partial refunds for dropped classes after the two-week time period.

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS

Accounts of students who fail to meet the specified deadline for paying any fees at the iDream School of Ministry are considered delinquent. Students with delinquent accounts will not be

permitted to enroll in classes or receive a copy of their transcript and/or diploma until all financial obligations are satisfied.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

Students failing to achieve a passing final grade of "C" or better in a course will be placed on academic probation for one semester. Students that obtain an accumulative grade point average less than a 2.0 will be placed on academic probation.

RE-ENROLLMENT IN A COURSE

Students failing to receive a grade of "C" or better in a course must re-take the course and achieve a passing grade. A student cannot retake a course more than two (2) times without the consultation and approval of an advisor or director

COURSE WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A student may withdraw from a course at any time before the first 5 weeks of each semester. To officially withdraw from a course, a student must complete a course withdrawal form available from the registrar. No monetary refunds will be given.

Students will receive a "W" on their transcripts, indicating they have officially withdrawn from the course.

Failure to meet the deadline for withdrawing from a course will result in the student receiving a grade of "F" or a final letter grade for the course deemed appropriate by the instructor.

In cases of an extreme emergency or of serious illness documented by a physician, students may be allowed to withdraw from a course after the first 5 weeks of the semester.

COLLEGE WITHDRAWAL

A student withdrawing from the iDream School of Ministry has decided not to continue to pursue a degree at the academy. Students seeking to withdraw from the school and all of their semester courses must complete an official withdrawal form available from the Registrar. A student failing to officially withdraw will receive a grade of "F" for all courses during the affected semester.

DISMISSAL POLICY

Failing to achieve a passing grade in two or more courses within the curriculum can result in dismissal of the student from the iDream School of Ministry. The student must

A student will be dismissed from the iDream School Ministry for plagiarism, cheating, bullying, threating and unlawful behavior. Professional and respectful behavior and decorum are expected of all students, staff, and instructors of the iDream School of Ministry.

RE-ADMISSION/ RE-INSTALLMENT POLICY

Students who have been dismissed or have voluntarily withdrawn from the ministry school can apply for re-admission to the program. The individual seeking re-admission must submit a letter to the Director and the iDream School Board identifying challenges and conditions that impacted their success. The letter should identify steps taken to correct the issues and support future success in the program. Re-admission letters will be reviewed by the Board. The Board may request to interview re-admission applicants. Re-admission to the iDream School of Ministry is not guaranteed.



GRIEVANCE AND APPEAL PROCESS

Students who believe that they did not receive an appropriate grade for an assignment or did not receive an appropriate final grade for a course may contact the course faculty and their academic adviser for a conference. At such time the faculty, student and academic advisor will review the grading criteria and will discuss how the grade was achieved. The course faculty reserves the right to grant the final grade for any assignment or for a course.

Students who continue to believe that they have not been treated fairly can appeal the decision of the faculty by making a written request to the Dean and Director of the iDream School of Ministry. The Dean and Director will determine if the situation warrants a review of the Board of Directors.



ATTENDANCE AND GRADE REPORT FORM

Attendance is mandatory for all iDream School of Ministry faculty are expected to maintain accurate attendance records for all classes.

All faculty are required to submit an attendance and grade report for each class at the end of each semester. Attendance and grade reports are to be submitted to the Registrar no later than one week following the last day of class.
